# How Much Do They Make?


A RESEARCH STUDY

New Evidence on the Early Career Earnings of Canadian Post-Secondary Education Graduates by **Credential & Field of Study** 

The data outlined in this infographic were generated from the new Education and Labour Market Longitudinal Platform (ELMLP). The platform links anonymous tax returns from graduates of publicly funded post-secondary institutions. On average, graduates are doing well—but there are large differences in earnings, both within and between fields of study.








